

The Liechtenstein Princely Navy – Promotions and Awards 2009

28 May 2009 – The Admiralty of the Liechtenstein Princely Navy is pleased to announce the following Promotions and Awards for 2009:

Medals:

Distinguished Service Medal (BRONZE)

With a training attendance of 81% (36/44): **Petty Officer 1st Class Alex Beck.** This actually reflects a deterioration in Petty Officer Beck's training attendance as he won the SILVER medal last year.

Distinguished Service Medal (SILVER)

With a training attendance of 84% (37/44) including the second highest Circuit Training attendance (21/24): **Able Seaman Rene Frauenfelder**

Distinguished Service Medal (GOLD)

With a training attendance of 89% (39/44) and the only crew member to attend all paddle training sessions (20/20): **SOF James Albritton**; and

With the highest overall training attendance of 91% (40/44) and the highest circuit training attendance (22/24): Admiral Silvan Colani

Liechtenstein Navy Medal of Valor (SILVER)

For providing the Navy yet again – free of charge – with the most fashionable post racing shirt (as well as an unauthorized and very gay training singlet): Lieutenant Junior Grade Beat Erne.

Admiral's LOVE Award

Liechtenstein Navy Star

Awarded for his unquestionable and unchallenged leadership skills, dedication and enthusiasm he brings to the Liechtenstein cause and in recognition of the undisputed technical and strategic knowhow and advantage he has brought to this team: Lieutenant and Chief Racing Officer Charlie Riding

Special Award for Navy Kick-Ass ("SPANK Award")

The SPANK Award goes to **Sailorette Hiko** for her dedication and passion in organizing the Navy's grueling Circuit Training program for the second year running which has resulted in an immense increase in fitness levels among the entire crew. By presenting this award, the Admiralty recognizes that her efforts have played a crucial part in achieving the amazing success of the season so far, particularly in the more demanding 500 meter races.

Sailorette Hiko also receives the SMILEY award for conducting her training with the highest possible enthusiasm, demanding never ending lounges, squats, sit-ups and press-ups with a constant smile on her face. Few such smiles have been reported on the faces of her subjects.

Unfortunately, despite her determined efforts, the crew has not lost as much weight as it should, as illustrated by the following award.





Fitness And Training ("FAT") Award

The FAT Award is presented to the heaviest three Sailors in the crew according to the Navy's Official Elephant Scale, scientifically proven to be the most precise and accurate weight measure device ever developed for military and commercial use:

Foster's Award For Fuel Efficiency

The Foster's Award For Fuel Efficiency remains with **Sailor Hannes Niggli** and **SOF James Albritton** for endurance and determination in yet again not consuming a single drop of Foster's fuel for the entire season. This is the fifth season in a row that Sailor Hannes has received this award and the second season for SOF James.

The Naval Safety Award

The Naval Safety Award is presented to the Navy's very dedicated early morning steersman, **Ah Wong**, whose excellent helmsman skills have saved the Navy from sinking a number of times in the most atrocious weather conditions. Specifically, **Ah Wong** is credited with preventing the Navy from an almost certain underwater maneuver on 14 May 2009 thanks to his quick reaction in steering the ship straight into the waves after taking on a huge amount of water.

The PUSSY Award

The PUSSY award is presented to **Able Seaman Rene Frauenfelder** for abandoning the crew and not participating in the Lamma 500 race without good reason, thus subjecting the Admiralty to the indignity of having to borrow a paddler from another team. The PUSSY award subjects the holder to general ridicule and embarassment and prevents the holder from being promoted for the next three seasons.

Admiral's Recommendation for Sleeping in the Extreme (ARSE)
